(U//FOUO) NCU Academic Misconduct Message Transcript

(U//FOUO) Dr. Dana Peterson, Provost for the National Cryptologic University appears onscreen.

(U//FOUO) [Dana:] Hello! I'm Dr. Dana Peterson, Provost for the National Cryptologic University.

(U//FOUO) Major General Matteo Martemucci, Deputy Chief of Central Security Service, appears onscreen.

(U//FOUO) [Gen:] I am Major General Martemucci, Deputy Chief of CSS.

(U//FOUO) Master Chief Noam Cohen, the National Cryptologic University Senior Enlisted Leader, appears onscreen.

(U//FOUO) [SEL:] And I am Master Chief Cohen, The NCU Senior Enlisted Leader.

(U//FOUO) As Dr. Dana Peterson speaks, a student writes in a notebook.

(U//FOUO) [Dana:] Welcome to the NCU! As the Provost, I am the Chief Academic Officer for NCU. I am responsible for ensuring that training standards are met and that academic integrity is maintained.

(U//FOUO) [Gen:] As members of the National Security Agency's unified workforce, academic integrity is important to all of us and academic misconduct will NOT be tolerated in any form.

(U//FOUO) As Master Chief Cohen speaks, an instructor hands out papers in a classroom. Also, a student is shown cheating, copying answers onto a test that they have written on their hand in ink. Another student watches a soccer game on a laptop. Another student smashes his hands down on his keyboard.

(U//FOUO) [SEL:] Academic misconduct is any act, or attempt, which gives an unfair advantage to the student. Additionally, any behavior specifically prohibited by a faculty member in the course syllabus or class discussion may be considered as academic misconduct. Academic misconduct includes, but is not limited to Cheating, Misuse of academic materials, and Violent or threatening behavior.

(U//FOUO) As Dr. Dana Peterson speaks, students work together at a whiteboard. Then a NCU policy book appears.

(U//FOUO) [Dana:] Students are expected to exhibit honesty and integrity in their pursuit of education and training at the NCU. Students are also expected to conduct themselves as professionals, consistent with and in accordance with NSA/CSS policy and NCU policy.

(U//FOUO) As Major General Martemucci speaks, a service member questions the consequences of his behavior.

(U//FOUO) [Gen:] Whether you're in a classroom or online, military student behavior should be consistent with the standards established by the local service unit. Students who are unwilling to abide by these basic expectations will find themselves facing academic and/or disciplinary sanctions.

(U//FOUO) As Master Chief Cohen speaks, a student copies and pastes content from a keyboard; another student cheats on a test with answers written on a scrap of paper. Then after a student and an instructor argue, a student is asked to leave a class.

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(U//FOUO) [SEL:] Violations of NCU's academic misconduct policy, to include Plagiarism, Cheating and Misbehavior can result in dismissal from the class and receiving a failing grade.

(U//FOUO) [Dana]: Cases of academic misconduct are reported to the Inspector General, Security and Employee Relations.

(U//FOUO) As Major General Martemucci speaks, a service member sits at a computer in anguish at the consequences he will now face.

(U//FOUO) [Gen:] Incidents involving military members will be reported to the member's local service unit and may result in additional punitive actions in accordance with the UCMJ.

(U//FOUO) As Dr. Dana Peterson speaks, an NCU policy book appears.
